Priorities for Change

- Shorten timelines and delineate "off-ramps" for detained individuals
- Codifies the "field petition" process from 66-329 which recognizes that all individuals meeting commitment criteria are in crisis, not just those detained by law enforcement or a hospital
- Adds designated examiners and mental health professionals to the list of individuals able to submit applications for commitment.



Idaho Behavioral Health System

Mental Health

Mental health includes our emotional, psychological, and social well-being. It affects how we think, feel, and act. It also helps determine how we handle stress, relate to others, and make choices. Mental health is important at every stage of life, from childhood and adolescence through adulthood. Mental Illness

A syndrome characterized by clinically significant disturbance in an individual's cognition, emotion regulation, or behavior that reflects a dysfunction in the psychological, biological, or developmental processes underlying mental functioning.

Substance Use Disorder

A problematic pattern of using alcohol or another substance that results in impairment in daily life or noticeable distress.

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

Approved 2024 Media Plan Recap:

-Media Plan spend: \$300k -Add'l \$34k (sep. budget) for SB and extra OOH -Ran for ~5 months -Jan launch with mid-Feb full ramp up -Targeted three distinct audiences -Skewed slightly male in some areas -Held consistent presence through May -Built on media successes in 2023 -New: Reddit, YouTube Shorts, ESPN, Super Bow

Overall, research results reflected a more informed and engaged public:

- Media connected with all Idahoans, most of whom this year reported notable increases in *"drug use being a big problem in Idaho"*. Total *"concern about fentanyl"* hugely up since Nov '22
- 2. The campaign's modest budget increases to "All Idahoans" may have helped boost fentanyl knowledge across many Young Adults (early 20s) that was seen in the research (particularly when paired with YouTube and Reddit).
- 3. A more diverse media delivery approach likely helped foster a rise in messaging resonance surrounding more accurate information about fentanyl.
- 4. The website saw 15% "engaged users" (which was higher than the 2023 campaign) from 65,000 sessions during 5-month campaign.
- 5. Organic traffic was notably up, reflecting more campaign familiarity.






Awareness Survey

Substance Use in Idaho




In general, how would you describe teen and young adult drug use in
