#### PARAMETERS OR CONSTRAINTS

Although we recognize the needs of other helpers, such as those working in the medical and behavioral health professions, the scope of this team is limited to addressing the unique hardships facing those working as first responders, and adult and juvenile correction officers, adult and juvenile probation officers, or others working within the justice system, and family members of these workers.

#### **HIGH-LEVEL RISKS**

Even with limiting the type of helper occupations, there are many constituencies represented such as fire, police, sheriff, EMT, dispatch, adult and juvenile correction officers, adult and juvenile probation officers, criminal investigators, crisis responders, and family members of these first responders. It may be difficult to enact effective solutions for everyone in this group, whether collectively or targeted to individual occupations.
